The Setting

The hidden hedged gardens of Warwick's Hill Close Gardens ...

are rare survivals of Victorian gardens once used by townfolk living above their business to escape from the crowded town. The garden offer many opportunities from social, environmental and scientific to language and creativity. These include:

- ⊗ developing an insight into Warwick's history
- ⊗ exploring how a community worked together to save the site and restore the garden
- ⊗ investigating the wide variety of plant growth, including fruit trees and other fruit and vegetables
- ⊗ a chance to see gardening techniques in action
- ⊗ exploring the habitats of a variety of insects and birds
- ⊗ a chance to explore our 'green building' and how we use the environment to preserve precious resources
- ⊗ experiencing a range of colours, textures and sounds to stimulate all of the senses

We offer a friendly service with our Education Team to make your visit a successful one! Visits are tailor made for your requirements. We cover The Foundation Stage, Key Stage One and Two of the National Curriculum.

Our facilities and services include;

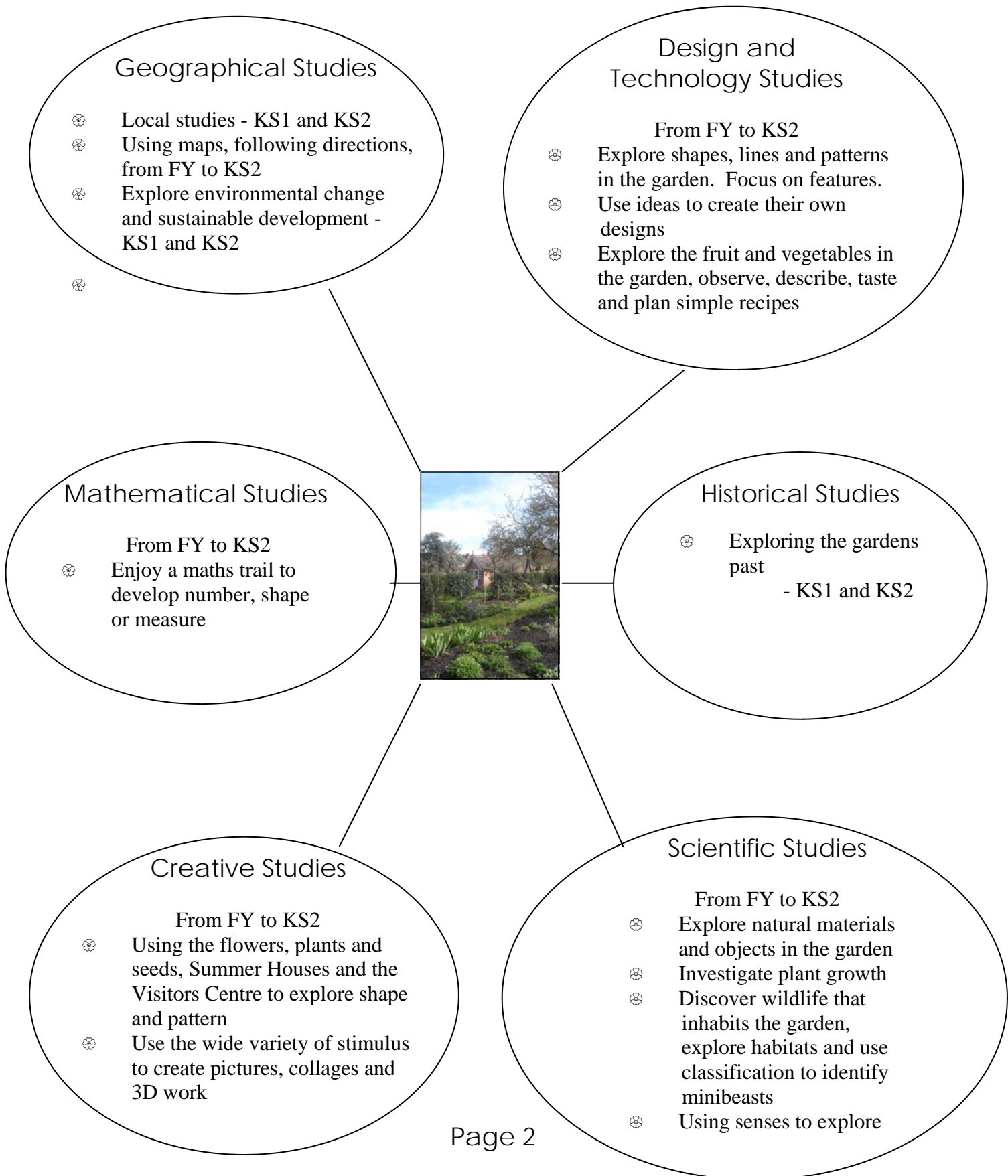
- ⊗ pre visits for teachers who are interested in bringing their class
- ⊗ services of our Education Officer to liaise with, plan, organise and lead the activities
- ⊗ a team of volunteers to support activities
- ⊗ tailor made programmes linked to the National Curriculum and your topics and themes
- ⊗ a warm, clean visitors centre for indoor activities
- ⊗ provision for children and adults with disabilities, including a flat, wide path into the centre, indoor facilities all on one floor, a disabled toilet and wheelchair route around the garden
- ⊗ access to the plots within the garden
- ⊗ a children's garden for digging, planting and soil exploration
- ⊗ a projector and screen is available
- ⊗ indoor refreshment facilities
- ⊗ free parking for 2 hours is available in the car park

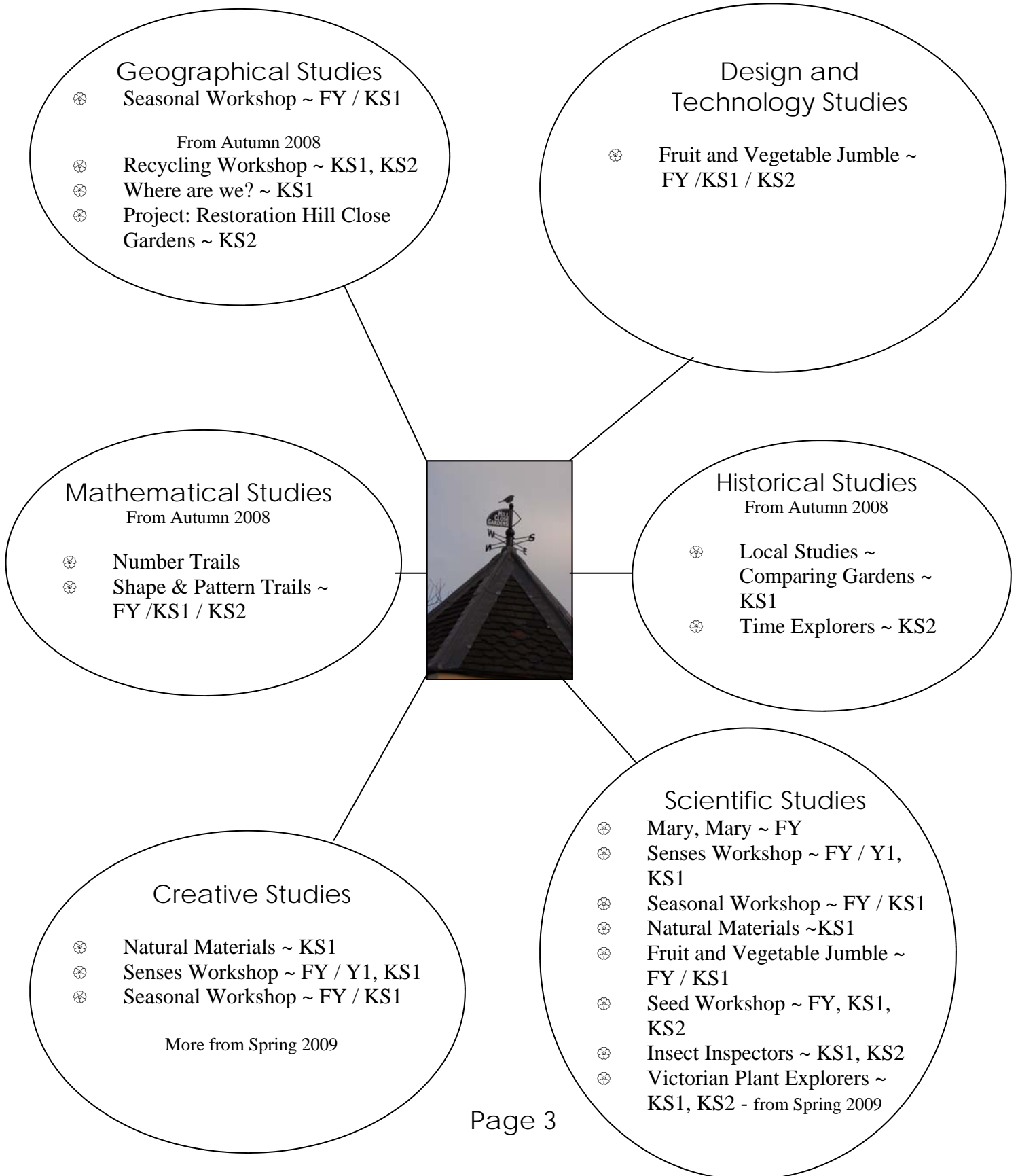

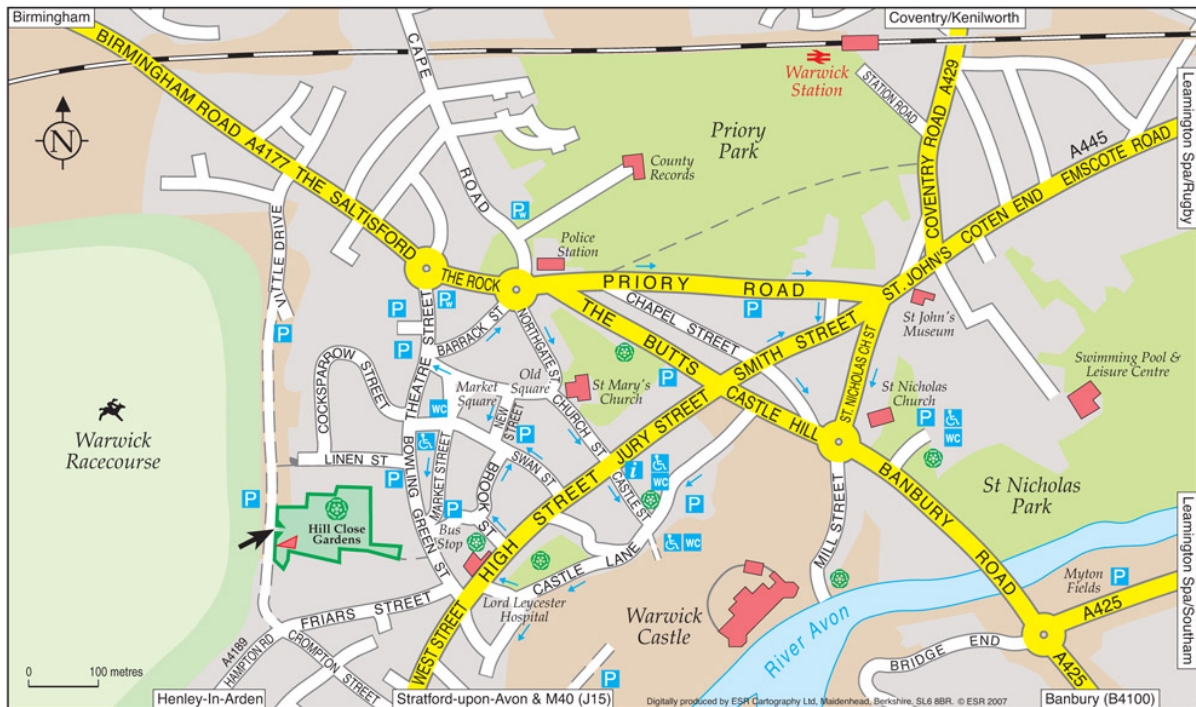

Visiting The Garden

Location

The Garden is situated next to the racecourse in Warwick. There is easy access by foot and car. There is a large car park, where you can get 2 hours free parking.

Toilets

We have two toilets, one of which has facilities for disabled visitors. These are situated in the Visitors Centre.

Refreshments and Picnics

We have a fully equipped kitchen to provide refreshments for both adults and children. If your visit is across the day, there is an open grassed area available for picnics if the weather is kind enough, alternatively, the Visitors Centre can be used.

Shop

We do have a small gift shop which stocks several small items for children. The use of this is entirely at your school's discretion, in line with your school visits policy. If needed, time can be planned into your programme for this.

Planning your visit

We can accommodate one class for each visit. A visit can be booked for a morning or whole day, depending on the activities planned. Morning visits can be arranged between 10.00am and 12.15pm and whole day visits between 10.00 am and 2.30pm. There is some flexibility in start and finish times, please speak to our Education Officer.

We want your visit to be a success and will take every care to look after you during your stay with us. We want to provide a safe environment for your visit so we ask you to consider the following when planning your visit;

- ⊗ We recommend an adult to child ratio of 1:3 for Pre School children , 1:5 for Reception children, 1:6 for Years 1– 3 and 1:10 for Years 4 - 6. Our Education Team will organise and lead your visit, but won't be expected to accompany groups or individual children on their own.
- ⊗ It is the responsibility of the accompanying adults to ensure the appropriate behaviour of the children. We ask you to respect the plots within the garden and consider that there may be Garden Volunteers working in their plots.
- ⊗ We are aware of the risks which may occur in a garden and have carried out our own risk Assessment. Our Education Officer can offer guidance for your visit, but we recommend that you make your own risk assessment before your visit. All teachers will be invited to make a free pre-visit with our Education Officer.
- ⊗ As many programmes will use both indoors and outdoors, please dress appropriately for the weather. We recommend warm, waterproof clothing and ask you to bring Wellington boots to change into for outdoor activities (to keep feet dry and alleviate slipping indoors on muddy footprints!). If it is sunny, we recommend that the children have had sun cream applied and wear a hat.
- ⊗ To ensure we are prepared for an emergency, we aim for all of our Education Team to have emergency first aid training. There should always be an 'Appointed Person' on site. However, it is your responsibility to meet any First Aid needs of your group. If any of the children or adults have any medical needs or allergies, please ensure that all adults are aware, including adults from Hill Close Gardens.
