



## Nursery and plant sales .....

The nursery has now been expanded so that members of the public have the opportunity to browse among a wider range of plants than was previously available. Many of the plants are propagated from stock plants growing in the Gardens, and may not be available at garden centres. The range of plants reflects the numerous varieties of perennial plants and herbs which can be seen in the garden.



This year there are semi-hardy and indoor plants which have been grown in the glasshouse including some which are used for display purposes.

Vegetable plants are available according to the season, and freshly gathered fruit and vegetables are on sale most weekends. Beans, both broad and then runner, and new potatoes are a very good buy. Soft fruit includes gooseberries and currants as well as rhubarb. These are followed by apples and pears later in the summer.



Early summer is the time to consider extending the flowering season of your garden into September and October. Asters, chrysanthemums and other autumn flowering perennials are easy to drop into those gaps which appear mid summer.
